



What to bring

- A tent with rainfly
- (Recommended) a ground cloth/tarp (a.k.a. footprint)
- Sleeping bags and/or blankets warm enough for 35-40 degree nights
- (Optional) Pillow
- (Recommended) Foam pad/insulated air mattress/cot
- Warm clothes, warm coat, including winter hat and gloves/mittens
- Flashlight
- (Optional) lantern
- Rain gear or poncho (could be damp due to morning fog)
- Sun protection (hat, sunscreen, sunglasses)
- A full water bottle
- Camping mug
- (Recommended) Lawn chairs

More about Tents


- Each family must sleep in their own tent.
- NO Scout may sleep in a tent with a non-family adult.
- NEVER use a heater or open flame inside a tent.

Sleeping in the outdoors

- This time of year, it can get into the upper 40s at night, with an average nighttime low of mid-50s.
 - This might feel too cold for sleeping, especially for a child.
- Know the temperature rating of your sleeping bag and be prepared with multiple layers of warm clothes and lots of extra blankets.
 - Also, understand that the temperature rating is not always the comfort rating; a 40-degree bag will not be comfortably warm at 40 degrees. A miserable night of not sleeping because you're too cold can ruin a camping experience for a child (or an adult).
 - Better to have too many blankets and extra clothes than not enough

The Scouting Six Essentials

 - Preferably transparent bottle
- Sun protection
 - Sunscreen, hat, sunglasses
- Whistle
- First Aid Kit
 - o Bandaids (moleskin, antibiotic cream, insect sting treatment)
- Trail Snack
- Flashlight



Some of these we will coordinate as a pack, but families are always encouraged to go on their own as well.


